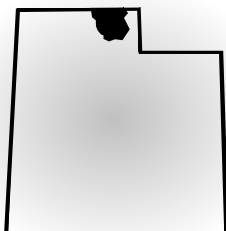

Cache County historically has been driven by production, processing, and distribution of agricultural products. Because of this, it has a substantial dairy and meat products industry. Utah State University is an economic bulwark of the area, employing about 6,000. USU's research activity has spawned many companies that have added jobs. Job growth is still positive with gains in service producing sectors making up for losses in manufacturing. Expanding population continues to generate construction activity. As any significant job growth continues to sputter, Cache County's economic base still remains strong.
